



STUDENT MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING

USU Uintah Basin Concurrent Enrollment

- ❑ A high school student must have a cumulative GPA of 3.0 or higher or as per school district policy to register for USU Uintah Basin Concurrent Enrollment (CE) Courses. Only Junior and Senior high school students will be permitted to enroll in Utah State University courses. A written authorization is required by the high school principal to allow Sophomore registration.
- ❑ The content of these courses will be appropriate for college students. The curriculum may include controversial cultural, religious, political, aesthetic and human sexuality issues. It is expected that high school CE students who enroll in the classes will have the appropriate critical faculties necessary for engaging with the material in an objective manner.
- ❑ A college level course demands responsibility and maturity proportional to a college student. This course will require rigorous academic work. A college level grading scale will be used; no late or makeup work will be accepted without prior arrangements with the instructor. Regular classroom attendance and participation are a requirement, and failure to attend will affect grades. The instructor has the authority to drop a student from the class if student does not attend.
- ❑ Students enrolled in USU CE courses are generating a permanent college record that will be applied to all of the students' higher education pursuits after they graduate from high school. The college grade and the high school grade will be the same.
- ❑ Utah State University is one of the nation's premier student centered land-grant universities. USU strives to achieve the highest level of excellence in learning and quality instruction in an environment of trust and respect. Students who demonstrate a pattern of disruptive behavior while participating in CE courses may be removed from the course by the instructor or facilitator.
- ❑ All USU Uintah Basin instructors of Concurrent Enrollment courses will give by the end of the third week of the trimester or fifth week of the semester an evaluative assignment or series of assignments (i.e., tests, written papers, reports, quizzes, etc.) worth a substantial percentage of the course grade. Any student failing these evaluative assignments (earning below "D" grade) will be required to drop the course immediately.
- ❑ High school students are expected to maintain a *2.0 cumulative GPA*. **Academic Warning** – Student's most recent semester GPA is below 2.0. A registration hold is activated. *Solution:* Student needs to visit with advisor and sign a Warning Acknowledgement and hold will be lifted. **Academic Probation** -Students who have two consecutive terms/semesters of a term GPA below a 2.0 will be placed on "Probation" with the program and will be suspended from enrolling in future Concurrent Enrollment courses. Students will be responsible for repeating a previous course(s) to raise their GPA. Students repeating courses are required to pay full tuition and fees for the repeated course.
